

Before you actually install the theme, you should import the dummy content provided in the Assets folder. I'm assuming you have Wordpress installed on your server. So, navigate to the Wordpress dashboard. Go to Tools>Import>Wordpress.

Wordpress might offer you to install the wordpress importer plugin, if you haven't installed it before do it now.

Once you've reached there, browse to the XML Dummy content file provided (`Assets/pheno-dummy-content.xml`), and upload it. Make sure that when the option is shown, you check the "Download and import file attachments" box. That concludes the content imports. Now we move on to the theme installation.



Unzip the “Phenomenon 1.0.zip” file and upload the extracted “Phenomenon” folder into your `wp-content/themes` folder on your server. After doing so you should have inside your `wp-content/themes` directory a folder called “Phenomenon” that contains all the theme files.

Now that you've got the theme installed, you have to activate it. Go to Appearance>Themes and click 'Activate' under the Phenomenon theme. So far so good. However, if you go to your website, the site might appear strange. No problem, just continue with the setup.


This Theme uses in some places the [Timthumb plugin](#) and in order to make it work properly you need to locate the "cache" folder which can be found inside the scripts folder. and change this "cache" folder's permissions to 777. If you don't know how to do it just look at the picture below. I have used the free ftp program called [FileZilla](#) to do that.





A very important step in making sure this theme will work properly is making sure you have the default wordpress Reading settings. To do this, go to Settings>Reading and edit the settings to the image shown below.



And also an optional but I believe a good thing to do is change you permalink settings. To do this, go to Settings>Permalink and edit the settings to the image shown below.





C) Widgetized Areas & Custom Widgets Top

The next step is to set up your widgets. This theme is widget-ready and it comes with 4 widgetized areas. Fill those areas with the widgets you like.



Note: When using the default wordpress "Search" widget – make sure you give it a title and not leaving it blank or else it will break the sidebar code.


